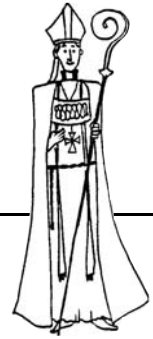

## Rector's Reflections

It isn't often that General Convention (which meets every three years) is held in our own state. Although not everybody gets excited about this nine day gathering of Episcopalians, it presents opportunities for learning and legislation, fellowship and worship to name a few. To learn more about General Convention Marcia Splinter, Blake Quay, Bill Snyder and I attended the Regional Meeting at Brecksville. There we reviewed some of the Diocese of Ohio Curriculum and learned about Episcopal polity (how the Church is governed). We also had discussion about some of the issues and resolutions facing the Church. The mood was mainly positive; we met the deputies we elected at Diocesan Convention 2004 and asked questions of them and the bishops.

The vestry recommends we gather for at least one session to share information from the *Ohio Curriculum on Church polity, the "Anglican" way, and General Convention*. With the events we've had scheduled the past four weeks, Sunday, June 4th, is the first day we can present the curriculum. We invite all to join our review and discussion on Sunday, June 4th, 11:30, in the parish hall.

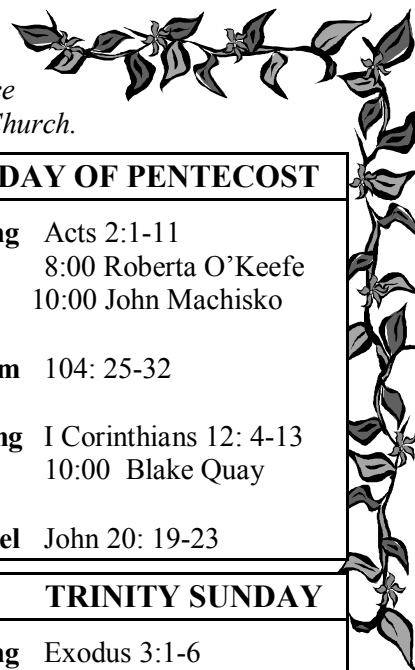

## *Two Big Ones Done, More to Come...*

- **Flower Sale** - A big "THANK YOU" to all who helped with the flower sale (organizing, selling or buying!). Once again this year it was a huge success with \$ 715.00 in profit coming in.
- **"The Crosses"** – several people have asked about where the crosses came from. There was a parish member from New Life Episcopal in Uniontown that sold the crosses as a business. When they decided to retire, they donated their entire inventory to the church. New Life is selling lots of 75 crosses as a fundraiser for their parish, mostly to other churches to resell individually as a fundraiser. The crosses we sold at the plant sale covered over half of our investment, and we will sell crosses at the Balloon Affair and Fall Festival (and any other times we can come up with).

## The Whole World as 100 People

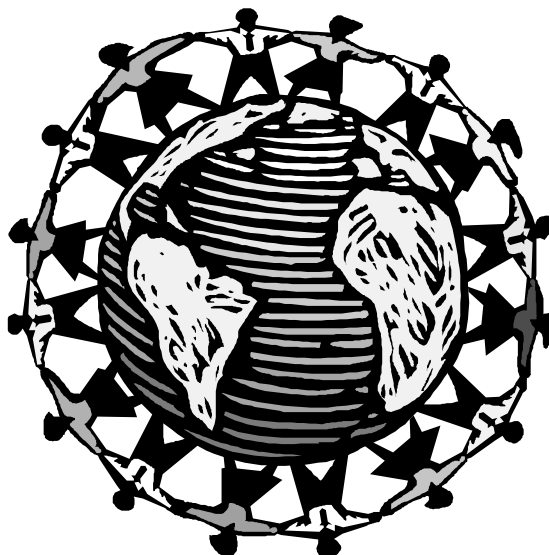
*Here's a interesting item to come past our attention. It will get you thinking...*
